

ORDINANCE NO. 11

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING, WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF GRANTIE FALLS, WASHINGTON, THE EMPLOYMENT OF IN OR PERMITTING FEMALES TO LOITER IN OR ABOUT ANY PLACE WHERE INTOXICATING LIQUOR IS SOLD, GIVEN AWAY OR DISPENSED AS A BEVERAGE: DECLARING THE VIOLATION OF ITS PROVISIONS A MISDEMEANOR AND PROVIDING A PENALTY THEREOF.

BE IT ENACTED by the council of the town of Granite Falls, Washington.

Section 1: No female person shall be employed by any person, firm or corporation, in any capacity, in any saloon, beer hall, bar room, dance hall, theatre or place of amusement, within the corporate limits of the town of Granite Falls, Washington, where intoxicating liquor is sold, given away or dispensed as a beverage.

Section 2: No person, firm or corporation owning, leasing or occupying any building used as a saloon, beer hall, bar room, dance hall, theatre or other place of amusement, within the corporate limits of the town of Granite Falls, Washington, where intoxicating liquor is sold given away or dispensed as a beverage, shall permit or allow any female person to loiter in or about such saloon, beer hall, bar room, dance hall, theatre or other place of amusement for any purpose or upon any pretense.

Section 3: Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than fifty dollars nor more than one hundred dollars and pay the costs of prosecution, which costs shall be added to and become a part of the fine or imprisoned in the town jail for a period of not more than thirty days or both fined and imprisoned at the discretion of the court. The punishments provided in this section of this ordinance are in addition to those provided for the violation of the same or similar provisions of the laws of the State of Washington.

Section 4: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from its passage and publication as required by law.
