

ORDINANCE NO. 117

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING IT TO BE A MISDEMEANOR FOR ANY PERSON OTHER THAN A REGULAR ORDAINED CLERGYMAN, PRIEST OR RABBI, ACTIVELY ENGAGED IN MINISTERING TO A RELIGIOUS CONGREGATION, TO HAVE IN HIS POSSESSION OR UNDER HIS CONTROL, INTOXICATING LIQUOR AS DEFINED BY LAW, WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF GRANITE FALLS, WASHINGTON.

THE TOWN COUNCIL of the Town of Granite Falls, Washington, does ordain:

Section 1: That it shall be unlawful for any person other than a regular ordained clergyman, priest or rabbi, actively engaged in ministering to a religious congregation, to have in his or her possession within the corporate limits of the town of Granite Falls, Washington, intoxicating liquor of any kind as defined and prescribed by the laws of the State of Washington, and any person violating the provisions of this Section, will be guilty of a misdemeanor and punished as hereinafter prescribed.

Section 2: It shall be unlawful for any person within the corporate limits of the Town of Granite Falls, Washington, to sell, or give intoxicating liquor of any kind as prescribed by the laws of the State of Washington, to any person, and any one violating this Section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

Section 3: Any person convicted of a misdemeanor under this ordinance shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$100.00, or by imprisonment in the City or County jail not to exceed thirty (30) days, or by both fine and imprisonment.

Section 4: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its publication, according to law.
