

ORDINANCE NO. 15

AN ORDINANCE FOR THE PROTECTION OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH:
PROHIBITING THE DEPOSIT OF, LEAVING UNBURIED OR BURYING
WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF GRANITE FALLS
OF DEAD ANIMALS OR OTHER OFFAL OR SUBSTANCE WHICH MAY BE,
OR BECOME OFFENSIVE OR DETRIMENTAL TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH,
DECLARING THE VIOLATION OF ITS PROVISIONS A MISDEMEANOR
AND FIXING A PENALTY THEREFOR.

BE IT ORDAINED by the council of the Town of Granite
Falls, Washington.

Section 1: It shall be unlawful for any person, firm
or corporation to deposit, leave unburied or to bury any-
where within the corporate limits of the town of Granite
Falls, Washington any dead animals or any offal or mater-
ial which may be or become offensive or dangerous to the
public health.

Section 2: It shall be unlawful for any person,
firm or corporation to throw out upon any lot, plot of
land, alley or street, within the corporate limits of
the town of Granite Falls, Washington, any butcher's offal
or garbage, or any other animal or vegetable substance,
whether solid or liquid, which is or is liable to become
putrid or offensive or dangerous to the public health.

Section 3: It shall be the duty of the owner, or
the person having custody thereof, to remove to some safe
place outside the corporate limits within twelve hours
after death, all animals dying within the corporate
limits of the town of Granite Falls and so dispose of
the same by burial or otherwise that will not be or
become a public nuisance and it shall likewise be the
duty of the party making, producing or having butcher's
offal, garbage or any other vegetable matter whether solid
or fluid, which is liable to become putrid or offensive
or dangerous to the public health, to remove the same to
some safe place outside of said corporate limits and so
dispose of the same by burial or otherwise that it will
not be or become a public nuisance.

Section 4: Any person, firm or corporation
violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall

be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than five dollars nor more than fifty dollars and the costs of prosecution, which costs shall be added to and become a part of the fine and be imprisoned in the town jail until such fine is paid.

Section 5: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication as required by law.
