

ORDINANCE NO. 168

AN ORDINANCE PERTAINING TO THE PROTECTION OF THE MUNICIPAL WATER SYSTEM.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Town of Granite Falls, Washington:

Section 1. Whereas, within the past year the Town of Granite Falls has completed a new water system at a cost of approximately Eighty Thousand Dollars, and

Section 2. Whereas, there have been certain depredations committed against the system at the storage tanks where the covers have been removed and the valves tampered with to impair and stop the flow of water, and

Section 3. Whereas, the health and safety of the whole community is thereby jeopardized;

Section 4. ~~NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED~~ by the Town Council in regular session that a standing reward of \$100.00 shall be paid to any person furnishing information leading to the arrest and conviction of the perpetrators of such vandalism.

Section 5. That the committing of such vandalism shall be considered a gross misdemeanor and be punishable by fine and or imprisonment as provided by statute.

Section 6. That a state of emergency is declared to exist and this ordinance will be in full force and effect upon due passage and publication.
