

ORDINANCE NO. 17

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A BENCH MARK FROM WHICH TO TAKE THE ELEVATIONS IN ESTABLISHING GRADES ON THE STREETS AND ALLEYS OF THE TOWN OF GRANITE FALLS, WASHINGTON.

BE IT ORDAINED by the council of the town of Granite Falls, Washington.

Section 1: The bench mark or base from which the grades of all streets and alleys, in the town of Granite Falls, Washington, shall be measured and established shall be that certain piece of granite rock which is buried at the intersection of Granite avenue and Pioneer street to mark the common corner of sections twenty-four (24) and Thirteen (13) in Township Thirty (30) north Range 6 E.W.M. Said rock being marked with a cross cut into its upper face and the intersection of the lines of said cross shall be the exact point from which all elevations shall be measured.

Section 2: Whenever the council shall establish a grade on any of the streets and alleys of said town of Granite Falls, the elevation thereof shall be computed from the bench mark hereby established and the same shall, in each case, commence with the number of feet or inches, or part of an inch that said grade at the point of beginning is above or below said Bench mark.

Section 3: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication as required by law.
