

ORDINANCE NO. 2

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE APPOINTMENT AND CONFIRMATION OF A TOWN MARSHAL AND FOR FILLING VACANCIES IN SAID OFFICE; DEFINING THE DUTIES AND FIXING THE COMPENSATION OF SAID MARSHALL OF THE TOWN OF GRANITE FALLS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the council of the town of Granite Falls, Washington.

Section 1: The Mayor shall appoint, subject to confirmation by the town council, a town marshal who shall hold office during the pleasure of the Mayor as provided by the laws of the State of Washington.

Section 2: The Mayor shall fill any vacancy which may occur in the office of town marshal by appointment subject to approval by the town council, as provided by the laws of the State of Washington and any person so appointed shall hold office during the pleasure of the Mayor.

Section 3: It shall be the Marshal's duty to see that the laws and ordinances of said town are strictly enforced, to execute all processes issuing from the proper authority to arrest and prosecute persons for the violation of the conditions of the ordinances of said town; shall be custodian of the city buckets, ladders and fire apparatus and perform all duties required of marshals of towns of the fourth class by the laws of the State of Washington and perform such other duties as may be required of him by the town council.

Section 4: The marshal shall be exofficio street commissioner and as such shall keep the streets and sidewalks in repair; keep the street crossings cleaned and in good condition; collect all poll taxes due to the town; shall have charge of and be responsible for the safe keeping of all the spades, picks, shovels, hammers and other tools kept by the town.

Section 5: The marshal shall be exofficio jailor and shall have charge of all persons confined in the town jail and shall furnish food and bedding for prisoners which food and bedding shall be at the expense of town and as such jailor, shall have charge of and be responsible

for the safe keeping of all hand-cuffs, balls and chains and such other property as may come into his hands as jailor.

Section 6: The marshal shall be exofficio pound master and have charge of and keep in repair a pound for the impounding of stock and shall feed and care for all stock impounded therein and perform all duties required of him by the ordinances of the town of Granite Falls in relation to the impounding of stock.

Section 7: No duty appointed by the marshal or other person employed by him shall receive any compensation from the town and no agreements entered into by said marshal in regard to same shall be binding upon the town unless said compensation be agreed to and the services ordered by the town council provided: That all employment for street work shall be ordered by and be done under the direction of the committee on streets.

Section 8: The marshal shall, before entering upon the discharge of his duties, enter into a bond with two or more sureties, to be approved of by the council, in the sum of \$500.00 condition for the faithful performance of his duties and the safe care and keeping of all property or money coming into his hands as marshal of the town of Granite Falls and that he will turn the same over to his successor or the proper authorities in the manner as prescribed by the laws of the State of Washington and the ordinances of the town of Granite Falls.

Section 9: The marshal shall receive for his services the sum of \$60 per month.

Section 10: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication as required by law.
