

ORDINANCE NO. 34

AN ORDINANCE DEFINING VAGRANCY AND PRESCRIBING THE PUNISHMENT THEREFOR.

BE IT ORDAINED by the council of the town of Granite Falls, Washington, as follows:

Section 1: All professional fortune tellers, all persons who keep houses or places where lost or stolen goods may be found, all habitual drunkards, all persons who wander about the streets in the night not giving a good account of themselves, all persons who wander about having no visible calling or business to maintain themselves and no visible means of support, all persons who lodge in outhouses or places other than places kept for lodging purposes, without the consent or permission of the owner, all lewd or dissolute persons who live in or about houses of ill-fame, all common prostitutes, all professional beggars who solicit alms within the limits of said town, and all persons conducting in any street or public or open place any game or pretended game of chance, shall be deemed vagrants.

Section 2: All persons convicted of vagrancy under the provisions of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100.00 or by imprisonment for any time not exceeding thirty days or by both such fine and imprisonment, and any person sentenced to imprisonment under the provisions of this ordinance, may be compelled during the term of such imprisonment to labor on the streets or other public property or works within the town.
