

ORDINANCE NO. 5

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE DUTIES AND FIXING THE BONDS OF POLICE JUSTICES.

BE IT ORDAINED by the council of the town of Granite Falls, Washington.

Section 1: There shall be appointed by the Mayor, subject to confirmation by the council, a police justice, who shall hold office during the pleasure of the Mayor, who shall have jurisdiction over all offences defined by any ordinance of the town and all other actions brought to enforce or recover any penalty or forfeiture declared by any such ordinance and full power and authority to hear and determine all cases, civil or criminal, arising under such ordinances and to pronounce judgment in accordance herewith.

Section 2: All civil or criminal proceedings before a police justice shall be governed and regulated by the general laws of the state relating to justices of the peace and to their practices and jurisdiction.

Section 3: The fees of a police justice shall be the same as those allowed by law to justices of the peace.

Section 4: Each police justice shall, before entering upon the duties of his office, execute a good and sufficient bond to the town in the sum of \$200, for the faithful discharge of his duties.

Section 5: Each police justice shall make a quarterly report to the council and shall turn over all money collected to the town treasurer once each month.

Section 6: This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and publication as required by law.
