

ORDINANCE NO. 60

AN ORDINANCE SPECIFYING AND ADOPTING A PLAN PROPOSED FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A WATER SYSTEM FOR THE TOWN OF GRANITE FALLS, WASHINGTON, DECLARING THE ESTIMATED COST THEREOF, AS NEAR AS MAY BE, SUBMITTING SAID PLAN OR SYSTEM AND THE PROPOSITION AND AUTHORITY TO INCUR INDEBTEDNESS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF SAID PLAN OR SYSTEM TO THE QUALIFIED VOTORS OF THE TOWN OF GRANITE FALLS, WASHINGTON FOR RATIFICATION OR REJECTION AT A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON THE 31st DAY OF AUGUST, 1910, AND CREATING A WATER FUND.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Town of Granite Falls, Washington:

Section 1. That the Town of Granite Falls, Washington, hereby specifies and adopts a plan or system for the construction and completion of a water system for said Town of Granite Falls, Washington, as specified and set forth in Section 2 of this ordinance; declares the cost thereof as near as may be; sets forth the proposition to mean indebtedness and to issue bonds of said Town of Granite Falls, Washington, therefor for the cost of construction of the same, and does hereby submit to the qualified voters of said Town of Granite Falls, Washington for their ratification or rejection at a Special Election to be held on the 31st day of August, 1910, said plan on systems of construction and the proposed authority to incur indebtedness and to issue bonds of said Town of Granite Falls, Washington. Therefore, for the cost of construction of said system.

Section 2. That the plan or system for said proposed construction of water works for said Town of Granite Falls, Washington, is hereby specified and adopted and the estimated cost thereof, as near as may be determined, is hereby declared as follows, to-wit:

It is proposed that the Town of Granite Falls, Washington purchase an appropriate as provided by law, the Northeaset quarter of the Southwest quarter (NE 1/4 of the SW 1/4) of Section 17, Township 30 North, Range 7 E.W.M. in the County of Snohomish and State of Washington, together with all necessary lands, rights-of-way easements, privileges and franchises, between the northeast quarter of the Southwest quarter of Section 17 above described and the proposed intake hereinafter described;

also between said proposed intake and the proposed reservoir hereinafter described and between said reservoir and the corporate limits of said Town of Granite Falls, Washington; to locate and construct an intake on the creek running through the Northeast quarter of the Southwest quarter of Section 17 above described; to construct a reservoir having a capacity of not less than four million gallons to construct a gravity supply system main not less than six inches in diameter from said proposed intake to said proposed reservoir to construct a gravity system main not less than eight inches in diameter from said proposed reservoir to corporate limits of said Town of Granite Falls, Washington to construct within the corporate limits of said town of Granite Falls, Washington and upon along and under the streets and avenues thereof, water mains as follows, to-wit:

On Grand Street, from Kentucky Avenue to Cascade Avenue, a main not less than four inches in diameter;

On Wallace Street, from Kentucky Avenue to Prospect Avenue, a main not less than four inches in diameter;

On Pioneer Street, from the connection with the supply main at the corporate limits of said Town to Granite Avenue, a main not less than eight inches in diameter; from Granite Avenue to Cascade Avenue, a main not less than six inches in diameter, and from Cascade Avenue to Anderson Avenue, a main not less than four inches in diameter.

On Union Street, from Alder Avenue to Cascade Avenue, a main not less than four inches in diameter;

On Stanley Street, from Alder Avenue to Cascade Avenue, a main not less than six inches in diameter; and from Cascade Avenue to Portage Avenue, a main not less than four inches in diameter;

On Indiana Avenue, from Stanley Street to Pioneer Street, a main not less than four inches in diameter.

On Kentucky Avenue, from Grand Street to Pioneer Street, a main not less than four inches in diameter; and from Pioneer Street to Stanley Street, a main not less than six inches in diameter;

On Wabash Avenue, from Stanley Street to Union Street, and from Pioneer Street to Grand Street, mains not less than four inches in diameter;

On Granite Avenue, from the South line of the right of way of the Northern Pacific Railway to Stanley Street, a main not less than four inches in diameter; from Stanley Street to Pioneer Street, a main not less than eight inches in diameter, and from Pioneer Street to the South limits of said Town of Granite Falls, Washington, a main not less than four inches in diameter.

On Cascade Avenue, from Stanley Street to Pioneer Street, a main not less than six inches in diameter, and from Pioneer Street to Grand Street, a main not less than four inches in diameter;

On Anderson Avenue, from Pioneer Street to Wallace Street, a main not less than four inches in diameter;

On Alder Avenue, from Stanley Street north six hundred sixty feet, a main not less than four inches in diameter, together with not less than twenty-two hydrants, to be located in such places as said Council may hereafter determine will give the best fire protection to the Town at large;

That the system be capable of supplying not less than fifty thousand gallons per day, and have a head sufficient to maintain a pressure of not less than eighty pounds per square inch; to construct and provide all necessary gate valves, and other appliances for the proper operation and maintenance of a gravity supply water system, together with the acquisition of such lands, rights, easements, privileges and franchises necessary therefore, as near as may be ascertained, is the sum of thirteen thousand Dollars (\$13,000.00).

Section 3. That there shall be and is hereby submitted to the qualified voters of the Town of Granite Falls, Washington, at a Special Municipal Election to be held on the 31st day of August 1910, in said Town of Granite Falls, Washington, for ratification or rejection, the construction and completion of the waterworks system specified and set forth in Section 2 of this ordinance, together with the proposition of securing a special bonded indebtedness bearing interest not exceeding six percent per annum payable semi-annually, to be an obligation against said Town of Granite Falls, Washington, outstanding against said Town;

That the special election herein provided shall be held according to notice and procedure prescribed by the laws of the State of Washington, and ordinance of said Town of Granite Falls, Washington, for the holding of special elections excepting that the ballots at said election shall have printed thereon the proposition set forth in Section 4 of this ordinance; and notices of election shall have printed thereon notification, and shall be published in the Granite Falls Post at least ten days prior to said election as required by law.

It is further required that the bonds shall be issued in denominations of Five Hundred Dollars each and shall be numbered from one to twenty-six consecutively; that they shall bear the date of their issue; that they shall be payable twenty years from said date; that they shall bear interest not to exceed six percent per annum, and shall be payable semi-annually, with

interest coupons attached; principal and interest shall be payable at the office of the Treasurer of said Town of Granite Falls, Washington, and attested by the Clerk of said Town of Granite Falls, Washington, shall be authorized to create a sinking fund by ordinance, to provide for the payment of said bonds.

Section 4. Said proposition shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the Town of Granite Falls, Washington, at said election, for their ratification or rejection by printing upon the face of each ballot provided for use at said election the following clauses:

1. In favor of the proposed plan or system for the construction of a water system for the Town of Granite Falls, Washington, by acquiring all necessary lands, rights-of-way, easements, privileges and franchises, constructing an intake reservoir, and constructing gravity supply system mains from said intake to said reservoir, and from said reservoir to the constructing watermains within the corporate limits of said Town, as set forth in Ordinance No. 60 of said Town, together with all necessary gate valves and other appliances necessary for the operation of said system; and authorizing an indebtedness of Thirteen Thousand Dollars (\$13,000.00), bearing interest at a rate not exceeding six percent (6%) per annum and the issuance of bonds of said Town therefor, which shall be an obligation against said Town of Granite Falls, Washington, so long as such indebtedness is outstanding all in accordance with the plan or system specified and adopted by the Council of said Town of Granite Falls, Washington.

2. Against the proposed plan or system for the construction of a water system for the Town of Granite Falls, Washington, by acquiring all necessary lands, rights-of-ways easements, privileges and franchises, constructing an intake and reservoir and constructing gravity supply system mains from said intake to said reservoir, and from said reservoir to the corporate limits of said Town and constructing water mains within the corporate limits of said Town, as set forth in Ordinance No. 60 of said Town, together with all necessary gate valves, and other appliances necessary for the operation of said system; and authorizing an indebtedness of Thirteen Thousand Dollars (\$13,000.00) bearing interest at a rate of not exceeding six percent (6%) per annum and the issuance of bonds of said Town therefore, which shall be an obligation against said Town of Granite Falls, Washington, so long as such indebtedness is

outstanding, all in accordance with the plan or system specified and adopted by said Town of Granite Falls, Washington.

Section 5. That there is hereby created and established a fund to be called the "Water Fund" of the Town of Granite Falls, Washington, into which fund the Town Treasurer shall set aside the revenues of the said water system of the Town of Granite Falls, Washington, so long as said obligations are outstanding against said Town, which after the payment of the necessary operating expenses may be transferred to the "sinking fund" for the redemption of said bonds provided for herein.

Section 6. The Council shall appoint one inspector, two judges and two clerks of the election who shall be and they hereby are authorized to receive, count and make return on the votes cast, which shall be done in the manner in which returns in general election are made. The result of such election shall be determined by such officials and the returns thereof shall be made to the Council of the Town of Granite Falls, Washington, which shall canvass the same and declare the result in the manner provided by law.

Section 7. Notice of the aforesaid proposition and election shall be given by the Clerk of said Town by publication in the Granite Falls Post and in each issue thereof beginning August 13, 1910 and ending August 27, 1910 and by posting in three conspicuous places in said Town at least ten (10) days before said election; and the clerk shall also provide the necessary ballots and other stationery necessary for said election and the returns thereof.

Section 8. In case a majority of the voters of the Town of Granite Falls, Washington, voting at said election to be held on the 31st day of August, 1910, shall ratify and adopt said plan or system for said proposed water system, and three-fifths of the qualified voters voting at said election shall assent to the incurring of said indebtedness, the Council of said Town of Granite Falls, Washington, shall proceed with the construction of said water system, and shall cause the same to be completed at the earliest practicable date.

Section 9. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication according to law.
