

ORDINANCE NO. 8

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE LEVY, COLLECTION AND PAYMENT OF AN ANNUAL ROAD POLL TAX UPON EVERY MALE INHABITANT OF AND SOJOURNERS IN THE TOWN OF GRANITE FALLS, BETWEEN THE AGES OF TWENTY-ONE AND FIFTY YEARS, UNLESS EXEMPTED FROM THE PAYMENT OF SUCH A TAX BY THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON.

BE IT ORDAINED by the council of the town of Granite Falls:

Section 1: That every male person resident of the town of Granite Falls, Washington, and every person sojourning in said town for six months or more, over twenty-one years and under fifty years of age, shall annually pay a road poll tax of one dollar, which shall be due and payable in money, without any exemption other than provided by the laws of the State of Washington, on the first day of March in each year, or in the case of sojourners, at the expiration of thirty days sojourn in the town.

Section 2: It shall be the duty of the town marshal to collect the road poll tax provided for by this ordinance and promptly pay all poll taxes by him collected to the town treasurer taking a receipt therefor.

Section 3: All delinquent road poll taxes shall be collected by an action for debt in the police court of the town of Granite Falls and any judgment of said court for road poll taxes shall include the costs of suit and be enforceable as judgments of justice of the peace under the laws of the State of Washington.

Section 4: All actions brought to enforce or collect a delinquent road poll tax shall be brought in the name of the town of Granite Falls and be prosecuted by the town marshal on behalf of said town.

Section 5: This ordinance shall be in effect and full force from and after its passage and publication as required by law.
