

TOWN OF GRANITE FALLS
SPECIAL ORDINANCE #325

A SPECIAL ORDINANCE AMENDING THE 1981 BUDGET, ALSO KNOWN AS ORDINANCE #300,
TO APPROPRIATE THE TOTAL SUM OF \$3744.21 TO THE POLICE BUDGET OF GRANITE FALLS.

Be it Ordained by the Council of the Town of Granite Falls, Washington,
as follows:

WHEREAS due to unforeseen events in the Police Department of Granite Falls, unforeseen operating expenses are required for the completion of Fiscal 1981.

It appears the budget is completely exhausted and depleted and that such deficiency could not have been reasonably foreseen, at the time of the making of said budget or amendments thereof; It is now necessary for proper and efficient operations of said department, that emergency appropriations be made so that the Department can function continually during the balance of the present year.

WHEREAS the State of Washington requires Criminal Justice Training for all Police Officers within 15 months of employment, such class commencing December 7, 1981, and

WHEREAS the primary transportation of the Police Department is in a state of collapse, requiring either extensive and major repairs or replacement not budgeted for in Fiscal 1981


Section 1: The Town Council of the Town of Granite Falls does amend the Fiscal 1981 budget to allow appropriation of \$1554.74 from the Current Expense Fund to the Marshal's Expense Budget for the purpose of maintaining Police protection for the people of Granite Falls to the end of Fiscal 1981.

Section 2: The Town Council of the Town of Granite Falls does amend the 1981 budget to allow temporary appropriation of \$1289.47 from the Current Expense Fund, for the temporary employment of an additional Police Officer while Officer Wagner attends the Academy, such money to return to the Current Expense Fund upon refunding from the State of Washington.

Section 3: The Town Council of the Town of Granite Falls does amend the fiscal 1981 budget to allow the appropriation of \$900.00 from the Current Expense Fund to the Marshal's Expense Budget for the purpose of purchasing a State Patrol Police Car to replace the existing inadequate vehicle.

THIS ORDINANCE IS HEREBY ADOPTED by the Town of Granite Falls this 30th day of November 1981.
