

## TOWN OF GRANITE FALLS

## RESOLUTION NO. 89-11

WHEREAS, the cities and the county of Snohomish are experiencing rapid growth with its attendant benefits and problems;

WHEREAS, continued growth could adversely affect our mobility, economic health, natural environment, recreational opportunities, and our ability to provide efficient public services; and

WHEREAS, the quality of life enjoyed by county residents can be maintained if the cities and the county jointly plan and act for the county's future.

## NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The cities and the county of Snohomish agree that greater cooperation between the cities and the county is needed to successfully meet the challenges of growth during the next three decades.

Section 2. The cities and the county of Snohomish agree that the concept of a long term growth strategy such as outlined in the Snohomish County Tomorrow program may offer an opportunity to address the future of the county and the cities.

Section 3. The cities and the county of Snohomish are willing to designate a special committee with an elected representative from each jurisdiction to work on the outline of a long term growth strategy and corresponding technical work program. The committee should submit its recommendations no later than December 15, 1989, for consideration by all city and county elected officials at a subsequent full assembly meeting.
