A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF GRANITE FALLS
SUPPORTING THE 100 YEAR CELEBRATION OF
PUBLIC HEALTH NURSING.

WHEREAS, Public Health Nurses have been preserving,
protecting and enhancing the health of the people of this
country for 100 years; and

WHEREAS, Lillian Wald, R.N. organized the nation's first
Public Health Nursing agency in 1893 and was the first nurse
to use the name Public Health Nurse; and

WHEREAS, Public Health Nurses work to prevent illness and
injury, strive to keep vulnerable populations healthy by
teaching health promotion, providing preventive health care
in a variety of settings, coordinating health care service
delivery to select populations, assessing the needs of the
populations they serve, and making recommendations regarding
these needs to policy makers; and

WHEREAS, Snohomish Health District Board Of Health believes
that Public Health Nursing plays an essential role in
protecting, preserving, and enhancing the health of the
people now and into the 21st century; and

WHEREAS, the importance of Public Health Nursing to our
communities should be recognized and supported.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that the City Council of the
City of Granite Falls does hereby recognize 1993 as the 100th
anniversary of Public Health Nursing and hereby declares that
the work of all Public Health Nurses be recognized and
publicly appreciated and supported as an investment in our
communities.
